Introduction

The hosting organisation is a mobile youth organization, which has been active since 1994 in the field of youth in Tallinn, Estonia. The role of the organization is to promote non-formal education involving youngsters starting from the age of eleven in different activities on local and international levels and provide a variety of activities for self-development.

The main activities and topics of the center involve youth cultures (theater, music, dance, and art), organizing workshops and entertainments for youngsters (Flash mob, forum-theater, juggling or different types of games), media and communication – intercultural learning through international projects, especially with the support of the Erasmus+ programme (Youth Initiatives, Youth Exchanges, Training courses, EVS projects). Often the activities are in cooperation with municipalities or cultural, social, volunteer organizations.

This project is providing the volunteer an opportunity to learn and develop through working with children and youngsters in the youth organization, having a direct contact with local ethnic minority community and a possibility to impact them directly. The environment in the center is bilingual, in addition to Estonian, the young people also speak Russian and English.

The organisation encourages the volunteer to take initiative in carrying out activities and, through implementing her/his ideas in work with children and youth, to develop herself /himself and skills for future life.

Location

The biggest part of work will be focused on the youth in Tallinn in the host organisation. However sometimes work will be in the second territory of organization Vihasoo – suburban camp Vihasoo (Tammispea village). There will be organized children camps and different projects for children and youth, where the volunteers will have the biggest part. The volunteers will have all services for work in both territories.

Benefits of volunteering

This is individual volunteering which means the aim is to provide the volunteer opportunities to realize their own ideas and aspirations in action through working with the youth.







Activities

Main activities in our organization will include:

- Working with the youngsters and children in our NGO as well as our local partners (other NGOs and schools);
- Working in urban and suburban camps during school holidays;
- Teaching language and leading events on introducing volunteer culture to the local youth and anyone interested;
- Organizing and taking part in various projects, workshops, events, entertainment activities together with youngsters;
- Leading workshops on different topics, all developed by the volunteer with help of NGO staff.
- Take initiative and realize own ideas in action (write own local project, organize event for children or other entertainment).

The main focus of work will be in the organisation, where the volunteer will try first-hand the methods of non-formal education. The personal timetable will be created in accordance with her/his needs and desires, but it will be flexible and available for revisions, if needed. Monthly reflection meetings are planned with the volunteer to follow his/her learning development based on the 8 competences in the YouthPass certificate.

Participants Profile

The aim of the organisation is to develop activities for children and youngsters who visit the center. The volunteer would be expected to appreciate young people, interact with them continuously, really take interest in them and in the activities. The volunteer would have to be proactive when interacting with the youth, take initiative in carrying out new ideas on his/her own but also help others in the process as well. Willingness to face challenges head on and also take responsibility are important qualities for the volunteer. The volunteer would be a vital part of the hosting organisation of teachers and youth worker.

Introduction

The organisation is a public youth center located in the north-western part of Estonia. The organisation coordinates the work of seven youth rooms based in different small towns. Local young people aged 7-26 are welcome to join wide range of leisure activities organised by the permanent staff or initiate their own projects. The volunteers will be assisting a team of youth workers in daily activities of the centers in various locations giving a chance to see many places including beatiful nature and meet people around Lääne-Harju county. The youth worker provide task related support and guidance to the volunteers by always work with them. Developing ideas and taking initiative is encouraged and fostered. The core values of the organisation are inclusion, cultural diversity and promotion of non-formal education. The organisation is open to host inernational volunteers who would become part of their community.







Location

The organisation coordinates the work of seven youth rooms based in different small towns: Paldiski, Rummu, Padise, Klooga, Vasalemma, Laulasmaa and Ämari. The volunteers will visit different locations in every week and help with daily activities of the center. The volunteers will be housed in a shared flat in a small town in Keila which is located near Tallinn. There is a good bus and train connection between villages in the area as well as with the capital.



Work tasks

The typical working hours are 13 - 20.00.

The volunteer will mostly work with youngsters aged 7-15. Every youth center is a bit different but the ones in the villages have between 3 - 12 children at one time, the one in the town has more. The volunteer will always work with our youth workers. The volunteer is expected to help our youth workers with daily activities, such as communicating with youngsters, playing board games, arranging movie nights, doing art and craft workshops, planning outings, etc. Taking own initiative is encouraged and if the volunteer wishes to organise own events for the young people such as cultural evenings, cooking classes, sports games, hikes then that is very welocomed. There is always support available from the tutor as well as from our team of youth workers.

The main responsibilities of the volunteer

- Assisting youth workers plan and host various events and activities;
- Developing, coordinating and promoting leisure activities for young people;
- Creating possibilities for youth initiavies, free self-expression and creativity;
- Empowering young people to participate in work camps thus developing working culture

and promoting employability;

• Promote youth activities and Erasmus+ programme.

The volunteers will be part of ESC training cycle organised by Estonian National agency focusing on personal development and intercultural learning.

Introduction

The host organisation is an institution managed by Lääneranna municipality Government. The structural units of the youth center are youth rooms or youth houses (commonly known as youth work units) located in different areas of Lääneranna municipality. The youth center coordinates the youth work of Lääneranna municipality through youth work units and in cooperation with educational institutions.

The organisation in coordinating youth work in Lääneranna municipality. The main objective is to support young people, help them to create possibilities to volunteer in local and international level and we are quite involved and trying to be more in Youth in Action (Youth Exchanges, Erasmus+, etc.). In previous year we coordinated many projects, involving more than hundreads of local youngsters in volunteering in local society and as well abroad. We are engaged promoting Europe and its values to the local youth community. The institution works mainly with young people aged 7-26. The mission of the institution is to empower youth work in Lääneranna parish to achieve their full potential, to create opportunities for young people to contribute in local community and grow up to be responsible citizens. We are standing for educational approaches that privileges Non-Formal Education (NFE) as a methodology and encourage the use of experiential methods (learning by doing), surprising activities (art/provocation), including information and communication technologies







(ICT), and finally, using music and outdoor activities (sports and nature) as tools for more active involvement of young people in our activities,

Location

The organisation is located in Lihula town, Pärnu county, Estonia.

Your main responsibilities will be

The arriving volunteer will have the opportunity to help out at the local school and youth centers around the Läänemaa municipality.

Main tasks of the volunteer will be as follows:

- organising and hosting a language and culture club at the local school. The main objective of the culture club will be to provide the opportunity for the local youngsters to get to know the culture, heritage, history and language of the volunteers' home country. The activities will be prepared, chosen and managed by the volunteer themselves.
- Doing youth work in Lihula Youth house. The volunteer will interact with local youngsters that come here after school, help out around the youth center and host an activity once a week: the activities itself will be for the volunteer to decide (painting, crafts, music or photography related, football club etc.) The main objective of this is to develop new skills and competences of the local youngsters and try out new things.
- Writing a column about ESC and volunteers' life at least 2 times a month for Lääneranna Noorteportaal. This will increase the visibility of the project, raise awareness about Erasmus plus and opportunities of the programme among local youth and help the volunteer to reflect back on how their ESC journey is going on a regular basis.
- Doing youth and culture work at Lõpe klubi one day a week. In Lõpe we have a wonderful youth and culture center where there is plenty opportunities to apply yourself creatively and socially while helping out with organising and running events for the whole community of Lõpe and surrounding areas.
- Helping out with organising youth activities in Kõmsi noortetuba. In Kõmsi there is a small space for the youngsters to come together which would really benefit from outside help; exposure to the foreign culture and language would mean a lot for the local kids, The volunteer will be able to plan and organise

Benefits of volunteering

We have a team of very dedicated, friendly and helpful youth workers in our county who are ready to support the volunteer on their stay here with whatever is necessary. I am sure almost everyone says so when inviting the volunteer here, but we really do mean it. We are excited to share our culture, language, heritage and everything we can with you!

We will offer the position of Mentorship to one of our local youngsters: if this way the volunteer will have an easier time connecting with and getting to know the local youth.

We are not very strict in terms of how the tasks should be done; there will be a lot of opportunities for the volunteer to take initiative and creative decisions when it comes to organising their work hours and actions on a weekly basis. We want the volunteer to be able to genuinely contribute a piece of themselves and their culture to our community, hence we will try to be supportive and motivational to our best ability, but not set any rigid frames so that the volunteer can take responsibility and initiative in designing their ESC experience.

The volunteer will have a pretty diverse set of work tasks in different establishments around the county. This will allow the volunteer to get acquainted with the local culture, language, customs and people on a wider scale. And vice versa; in this way the results of volunteers working here will reach a wider range of local people.





The volunteer will be able to enjoy the beautiful Nature of West Estonia, from the coastline and the Baltic sea, to the Matsalu nature reserve and serene bogs and woodlands. We will provide the volunteer with a bike to help you on your adventures around the Lääneranna parish.

Participants Profile

- **Readiness to work with children and youth**. This is the most important thing about the whole project. The volunteer needs to be interested in youth work or be comfortable with working with kids aged 7-18.
- In the institution we try to base our work around the principle of supporting, guiding and uplifting our youngsters, but not necessarily doing and organising everything for them, as developing a sense of initiative and entrepreneurship in our youngsters is very important for us. Hence you must be ready to be a team player and take a supporting role while organising events and activities with the youth. This might require at times patience and understanding.
- Be also comfortable with working individually when needed.
- Be prepared for the realities of living in rural Estonia. The winters are dark, the weather is moody and the local people are sometimes a little bit cold (not all, we promise! but it might take some time to get used to.) The towns in Lääneranna municipality are quite small, there are not many shops, cinemas or nightlife here. But we do have beautiful nature to make up for it
- Drive to try new things and work together with the local community for the good of the community.
- Be comfortable with using social media and have an interest for photography or videography. We have a lot of equipment in the Lihula noortemaja for you to use and create with.

Introduction

The hosting institution is an organisation which is made up of three schools and three kindergartens at Laulasmaa, Klooga and Lehola. The school and the kindergarten at Laulasmaa are the biggest. The school has 280 pupils and 85 employees, and provides primary education. The kindergarten has 126 children from the age of 1 to 6. The schools at Lehola and Klooga are smaller and each have around 60 students. The kindergartens at Lehola and Klooga both have about 50 children.

The institution maintains and develops Estonian culture by paying attention to Estonian language and the study of culture. In addition to the traditional subjects, the students learn folklore, crafts, art, folk dances, choir songs, music etc. Also, the children take part in hobby classes, contests and other projects.



To boost entrepreneurship and digital competence, the institution provides additional lessons on mathematics, entrepreneurship, career education, informatics, robotics and IT. The organisation cooperates with *Information Technology Foundation for Education* (HITSA) to complement their own digital equipment park and to train teachers. The students have successfully participated in the Robotics (Junior) First Lego League and Robotex.

The institution knows that non-formal learning is important. During breaks, the school offers the children a variety of activities. For example, every Wednesday there is a disco: children can dance which promotes health. The children have outdoor breaks, where they play outside. At the end of school day, the younger children have an after-school program to do their homework, play or do art. In addition, the children can participate in a wide range of hobby lessons: glass, wood, technology lessons etc. There have been different workshops in the school, and the school is ready to teach skills which can help the children in the future.

The school organises thematic weeks and other activities to value healthy lifestyles. Every year in April, it celebrates World Health Day by focusing on various health topics. For the institution, it is important that the children and the staff take care of their health. It has activities for the parents and the teachers: orienteering, sport games, outdoor activities etc.

Location

Laulasmaa is a village in Northern Estonia on the shore of Lahepere Bay and is 29 km away from the capital. The village got its name after its sand that has been mentioned to sing ("laulma") under the foot. There are about 700 residents living in Laulasmaa.

The beach is just 5-minute walk from the school. The school is surrounded by beautiful pine forests. In walking distance of the school are Laulasmaa SPA with saunas and pools, hiking trails, disc-golf trail and Arvo Pärt Center.

Your main responsibilities will be

- Present your own culture
- Practice English/German/Russian/or some other language with the pupils or teachers and parents in hobby groups
- Help to organize many different school events
- Help at field trips
- Help to guide the after-school program
- Organise a hobby group according to your own talents (art, music, sport etc)
- The institution knows that non-formal learning is also important. During breaks, we try to
 offer children a variety of activities.
 For example, every Wednesday there is a disco children dance, move and it promotes
 health. We have outdoor breaks, where
 children play outside. We would like to bring more youthwork and non-formal learning to our
 school.
- At the end of school day we have after-school program for younger children, (where they can do their homework, play or do art).
 In addition wide range of hobby lessons for children. The activities are different for example glass, wood or technology hobby lessons. There have been different workshops in our school and we are always ready to learn new skills, that can help children in the future.







Volunteers do not fulfill the tasks of great responsibility, eg they should not take the role of teacher / assistant teacher and plan and implement the activities of the formal education institution curriculum, but can contribute to the creation of additional activities and opportunities in formal education institutions (extra-curricular activities, hobby groups, etc.).

While choosing volunteers, special attention will be paid to young people who are either unemployed or have fewer opportunities another way, and for whom the experience of international volunteering would be even more useful and valuable. Introduction

The host organisation is a welfare organisation, where children who have been left without parental care or have behavioral or substance abuse problems, get professional help.

Children are hosted in these two shelters for various reasons, most common are vagrancy, home negligence, family violence, parental alcoholism or drug abuse, parental unemployment or loss of residence due to family poverty. Most of the children are brought to the shelter by the police or child protection worker.

The staff that works directly with the children consists of the manager of shelter, nine social workers and a nurse who all aim to provide the children a safe environment which helps to foster their personal development. Approximately 75% of shelter children are sent back home after their stay in the Shelter. If necessary, they remain under the supervision of the welfare worker.

This organisation has two centers in Tallinn.

Location

One of the shelters is in Nõmme subdistrict in Tallinn, the capital of Estonia. Bus connection is very good – it takes approx. 20 minutes to get to the city centre. This area is surrounded of big park and forest, which is a beautiful sight every time of year.

The other shelter is also situated in Tallinn, in the district of Lilleküla which is about 10 minutes away by bus from the historical center of Tallinn. It is located in a quite busy area and is easily accessible from any location of the city.







Your main responsibilities will be

After on-arrival orientation meeting aimed at the integration of the volunteer to local realities and explanation of aims and activities of the host project, the ESC volunteer will be carrying out the following tasks:

- Looking after the children and youth and helping staff in teaching them different useful skills
- Running additional educational activities in the house using its own facilities
- Teaching children foreign languages through joined games, songs, sport, any other activities indoor and outdoor, which the ESC volunteer will be running
- Presenting his/ her home country and its culture as a part of intercultural learning
- Arranging children's outings, e.g. culture visits, excursions, hikes, picnics, etc.
- Playing with children

Participation of motivated ESC volunteer is seen as an exciting innovative element refreshing the daily routine and bringing additional educational value to the pedagogical process. The main idea is to provide assistance and support local personnel in daily work, particularly in running various educational and free time activities for the children and youth. It is also to provide some experience and practice of foreign languages and intercultural learning both for children and local personnel. At the same time it gives valuable field experience of the social and youth work to the ESC volunteer accepted to the project.

A lot depends on volunteer's personality and mutual agreements. We expect the volunteer to be working from Tuesday to Saturday and

sometimes on mutual agreement to work on Sundays because the children are more available then for different activities. In that case volunteer's two free days will be during the week. Together with the volunteers the goals and objectives of the ESC will be set. Weekly plans will help set the frames and organise time. Since Tallinna Laste Turvakeskus has a long experience with volunteers, we know how to support and empower them. Our psychologists can also help with extra counselling if needed.

Introduction

The institution was established in 1963. At present, there are four groups – each group of 20-24 children, altogether around 90 children aged 1,5 to 7 years old.

One of the priorities is innovation, to be modern. The kindergarten has joined the projects

"Free of Bullying" and Eco school. The importance of environmental protection is attached to everyday life. In addition to the daily learning activities taking place in kindergarten, there are also music and sports. The kindergarten has a nice outdoor area and several events are held outdoors.

The main purpose of the organization is a high-quality basic education for children. The mission is to welcome every child in their friendly family and to provide pleasant conditions for a child to contribute to the development of their personality. It is important to know that every child would feel welcome, safe and positive among the kindergarten family throughout the day and would be happy taking part in everyday learning activities. The cooperation with the parents is very important hence many events involve families as well.

There are 20 people working in the kindergarten and 10 have a BS degree of education. All of our teachers have pedagogical education, in addition to the long experience of working in kindergarten. The teachers are open-minded and want to extend their knowledge by getting to know people from different cultures and nations.

The organisation opened its doors on January 1, 2001. Its main objective is to ensure a safe and secure growing environment for children and young people without parental care and to support families with disabled children. The institution provides several different social services, with the biggest and most substantial of the provided services being the substitute home service.







The institution is divided into 13 units: one of them is Shelter for Children and another is Shelter for Mothers and Children, both of which have hosted EVS and ESC volunteers already since 2005. **The main objective for the institution** is to protect **mothers and children**, but also to help mothers to get back their **self-confidence and independence**. Reasons for seeking assistance is mainly due to the problems with housing, family relations, and domestic violence. The shelter helps mothers to manage and organize their lives, find a job, register at a food bank etc. It is also important just to listen to their problems and to give them advice.

Location

The institution is in Tallinn, in the district of Nõmme, which is about 20 minutes away by bus from the historical center of Tallinn. The area is surrounded by a big park and forest, which is a beautiful sight every time of the year.

Your main responsibilities will be

The volunteers' main tasks are spending time with kids in the shelter, helping with organizing birthdays, holidays, special events, making crafts and decorations with the kids and mothers, helping shelter with different everyday tasks. Kids learn through playful activities inside the class and outside on different topics – math, Estonian, environment and science, arts and craft activities, robotics, and programming. We also have music lessons and physical education (for everyone) and for extra activities parents can send the kids to ceramics and art class, dancing, singing or yoga lessons. A big part of our learning environment is that we put a big emphasize on also learning outside of the kindergarten, which means we visit a lot of museums, parks, theaters etc.

Kindergarten has many means to make learning fun and modern – easy access to the city, creativity room with lots of art and craft supplies, IT-technology (teacher's computers, tablets, different kind of educational robots, interactive board etc). Every year we have many traditional events, where all the







kids, teachers and parents are involved. We all enjoy the preparation part as much as the event itself.

About the hosting organization

The hosting organisation is an institution with different departments and services for children and young people with mental or physical disabilities in Viljandi County. Regular activities in the organisation are aimed to provide everyday care and counselling, helping to raise children's and young people's awareness of themselves. It is run in cooperation with the specialists such as therapists, psychiatrists, social workers and youth-police. There are around 80 staff members all together in the institution.

The organisation provides services such as: childcare, (child) support, rehabilitation, substitution and aftercare. In the main building there is a nursery and a school for children with severe mental







or physical disabilities from the age of 1.5 to 19. Childcare services are offered to disabled children after school time. Support services for disabled children who need personal services to support them in their everyday activities. The rehabilitation centre serves about 115 children a year. The rehabilitation team has a psychologist, physiotherapist, occupational therapist, creative therapist, social worker, special educator and speech therapist. For substitution services, there are family homes and an apartment for orphans and kids with special needs. Each family has their own educator. Most of the children go to school and kindergarten during the daytime. In their free time, many children go to hobby schools.

The organisation wants to give them the possibility to experience a similar lifestyle as their contemporaries in biological families. Aftercare service is for studying and with youngsters up to the age of 25.

Activities

The volunteers role is to support the educator, daycare or be a support person while doing activities with kids and youngsters.

Everyday work is with kids who have special needs, including kids with physical disability. Activities can range a lot from helping kids to learn, deal with everyday tasks, and play with them. Doing arts and crafts and musical activities are very welcomed! Volunteer can also participate in study visits and help to organize different outings and excursions. The volunteer is expected to be a friend and role model for these children and help them to understand the delight of life. It is important to teach these children to evaluate their surroundings to find their way. Mostly the volunteer is helping out on workdays, occasionally there is help needed on weekends.

The main complex for work is Jaagu kindergarten and school, created for kids with special needs. Currently, there are 40 students. Kids study on 4-6 people groups, there are educators and support staff to help with that. Every student has a personalised curriculum, the main focus goes on developing social skills and communication. A volunteer is expected to be open and ready to learn extra pedagogical approaches, such as picture communication etc. Students also use different methods, and playful additions (such as robotics) and spend time outside.

The kindergarten is based on play, fairy tales, nature conservation, creative activities, and experiential learning, providing a mentally secure growth environment for children. It upholds values of friendliness, compassion, creativity, and unity.

Every week at the kindergarten brings a unique experience. Diverse topics and events can fill the week, offering different activities with the children. Volunteers actively engage in a variety of events, spanning festivals, exhibitions, tours, themed weeks, charity initiatives, and more.

Once a week, the volunteer can work with children aged 7-17 at the local youth center. Additionally, they occasionally share customs and traditions from their country with pupils at Võru primary school. Activities

- Participating and helping teachers in games and lessons with the children

It's crucial for volunteers to actively support the entire project duration, working closely with the children until its completion. Once a project concludes, volunteers transition to a new group to embark on another project. During the interim period between projects, volunteers collaborate with the music teacher.

The kindergarten has more than 40-year history and besides regular state program it follows traditions like days with family, sport activity days, visiting theatres and concerts, hikes and excursions during the year. It is the only kindergarten in Võru to teach swimming as it has its own on-site pool.

Introduction

The institution is a state-owned enterprise which provides social welfare services to adults with special needs. The enterprise was established in 2007. The organisation has many different little units.

The goal of the organisation is that the clients have an active and positive day no matter of their age, gender or disability. It provides opportunities for the clients to do activities like walking, games, dancing, singing, art and handicraft. The personnel monitors clients' health and development, provides medical care, teaches them basic skills and encourages every person to be as independent as they can.

The institution has been working with volunteers for years and there are volunteers yearly in different units. The volunteers can share their experience and thoughts with each other – the organisation can help arrange these kinds of communications and gatherings.

Location

The organisation is in Tartu, the second largest city in Estonia. Tartu has one of the Northern Europe's oldest universities and is a home for creative and scientific culture; there is always something happening from theatre performances to concerts and festivals. Your main responsibilities will be

The hosting unit offers community living service and daily assistance. The unit is designed for clients with a mental disability to feel comfortable. The center has 10 customers and the clients live in apartments, 3-4 people in each.

The unit has 2 workers to support the residents in everyday life activities: cooking, housekeeping, visiting a doctor and public offices, organising free time activities and planning the journey to work. Twice a week they go shopping to buy food for home cooking. The clients participate in public events





organized by the local community and private events organized specially for them by the supervisors. The goal is to help the clients to be as independent as possible. The supervisors are working in shifts from 8.00-18.00. From 18.00 – 8.00 they have the phone duty, so the clients can ask help if needed.

The organisation offers supervision and guidance for the volunteer from experienced staff. It also appoints a tutor to monitor the volunteers' daily duties and deal with task-related issues and questions that may appear throughout the project. The volunteer and the tutor discuss together possible activities and compose a working schedule.

Volunteers most important work will be helping staff in everyday activities and companying clients in community events.

We are expecting volunteer to:

- support and guide clients in their work assignments,

- support clients in using services in the local community (cinema, theater, public transportation etc.),

 organize and carry out gatherings and groups for clients (sports, handicraft, photography, cooking, movie nights, reading etc.),

- organize and help activity coordinators in arranging different functions and parties or spring bees, birthdays etc,

- help activity coordinators in their everyday work,

- make suggestions in enhancing our services.

The working time will be around 35 hours a week. The volunteer will have 2 days off per week either during the business days (from Monday to Friday) or at the weekends and additionally 2 days off per month.

Before coming to the service, it is recommended for the volunteer to learn basic Estonian.
